
CHARLOTTE EARTH DAY



Attendee Map Guide




SHUTTLES FROM GARINGER + SATELLITE PARKING AT 3600 SHAMROCK DR.

Short Film #1: Episode I of Docuseries | Directed By: Angela Hollowell at Rootful Media

Saying Goodbye to Forever Chemicals

Saying Goodbye to Forever Chemicals is a short documentary that focuses on the battle for clean water in Eastern North Carolina. The film delves into the impact of PFAS chemicals on local communities and the endeavors of activists and organizations to hold polluters accountable and advocate for stricter regulations. Democracy Green, an environmental justice nonprofit, takes center stage in the film as they engage the community, transitioning from advocacy to organizing and empowering residents to fight for their right to clean water. The documentary sheds light on the significance of community organizing in driving change, showcasing the inspiring efforts of local leaders and activists. Through interviews with community members, viewers gain insight into their challenges and successes, motivating them to take action and participate in the fight for clean water. Ultimately, the film highlights the power of community-led movements and the collective action needed to address environmental issues.

Short Film #2: Directed By: Resita Cox at Youth Film Camp Freedom Hall

Princeville sits atop swampy land along the Tar River in North Carolina. In the 1800's this land was disregarded and deemed uninhabitable by white people. After the Civil War, this indifference left it available for freed Africans to settle. Before its incorporation, residents called it 'Freedom Hill,' gradually establishing a self-sufficient town. Resting along the floodplain of the river, Princeville residents are no strangers to adversity. The historical town has been inundated with flooding over the centuries. Freedom Hill is a documentary that explores the environmental racism that is washing away the town of 2,000 through the lens of Marquetta Dickens, a Princeville native who recently moved back to help save her hometown and whose grandmother casted the historic vote in 99' as mayor against the federal and state government's recommendation to simply move the town elsewhere. Freedom Hill uncovers the continuing legacy of racism in the U.S. and how the refusal to reckon with its own history still impacts and extends into the lives and lands of Black Americans today.

350 Charlotte

CharMeck Climate Leaders

CharMeck Climate Leaders are a broad coalition of Charlotte-area organizations working to ensure the Queen City sets ambitious climate goals and successfully meets them. Together they are working to improve the health of communities by advocating for clean energy and carbon-reducing strategies.

Sol Nation's vision is to create self-lead BIPOC communities who prioritizes black issues, establishes climate justice solutions, and provides the next generation with access to knowledge and resources, including school curricula with environmental justice standards. Climate Reality Project

Climate Reality is a diverse group of passionate individuals who've come together to tackle the greatest challenge of our time. We are advocates, cultural leaders, organizers, scientists, and storytellers from around the world, committed to building a sustainable future together. Stop by for painting and parachute for the planet.



Johnson C. Smith University

JCSU integrates sustainability programs into academics, research, entrepreneurship. They will showcase a seed germination demonstration and have other small plants to explore. They will also have some equipment on hand related to testing water quality.



Keep Charlotte Beautiful

Keep Charlotte Beautiful is allowing the youth to sort a box of items into recycling, trash, or reuse using a litter grabber. In doing so, they will learn about proper recycling in Mecklenburg County and a little about their litter prevention programs.



Charlotte Wildlife Stewards

"Soil - How it is made" - CWS will showcase how soil is made through decomposition of vegetative material. The stages of compost will be exhibited as well as bins of duff with decaying plant material and the small invertebrates. The "FBI" - fungus, bacteria, invertebrates - will be highlighted.

Workshop Highlights

Looking to take a breather from all the passport activities? Well, we've got just the thing for you! Get ready to dive into some thrilling hands-on Earth Day workshops happening all across the lawn. From arts and crafts to land mapping, there's something for everyone to enjoy.

Community, Curricula, and Creative Conservation (C^4) Workshop w/ Ebone Lockett (Harvesting Humanities)

Conserving nature's resources is all of our responsibility. From the hands-on building and ornamenting bird-and-butterfly houses as pathways to protect our pollinators to demonstrating the benefits of composting food scraps and lawn clippings as soil solutions to protect the health and well-being of the soil and the human and non-human beings that occupy our earth, the C^4 workshop will offer ways to walk in that responsibility and put into praxis, environmental stewardship solutions that the youngest to the eldest of us can employ.

Tree Mapping w/ Vicki Aguilar (City of Charlotte Arborist Group)

One of the best ways we can protect, maintain and grow the tree canopy in Charlotte is to keep track of the trees in our city. That's why the City of Charlotte Arborist Group created Tree By Tree, the official inventory of trees in Charlotte, populated directly by residents. This will be an educational and fun program that encourages the community to connect with Charlotte's crowning jewel, its trees. As attendees walk through the Charlotte Museum of History using the Tree by Tree app to collect information about tree species, location, and condition, they play a role in the care of these trees while learning about the many benefits trees provide, such as, clean air and water, cooler temperatures in summer, and support for local wildlife.

Pollution Mapping w/ Tina Shull (Climates of Inequality)

In partnership with UNC Charlotte's Public History program and the Charlotte Teachers Institute. Climates of Inequality is a participatory public memory project created by students, educators, and community leaders in over 20 cities across the U.S. and around the world. Local teams work together to activate the histories of "frontline" communities: those who have contributed the least to the climate crisis but bear its heaviest burdens. Tina Shull, the creator, will be facilitating a mapping activity that centers Charlotte's pollution sites.

Mike Deeney - Avery & Masa: Protectors of the Endangered

Mike Deeney has a background as an elementary educator, youth mentor, writer, and changemaker. Mike has developed and executed a successful two-year Title 1 school literacy pilot program resulting in an dynamic increase in 3rd grade literacy scores. His students are improving their reading, protecting each other and learning about ways to protect our planet. He will be facilitating a story time and activity, where you can receive a free activity book to take home!



Wil Bosbyshell - Memory Tree Hanging Exhibit

Will Bosbyshell describes himself as 'an artist whose work is rooted in a love for the natural environment, and our intimate but often unconscious relationship with it.' Wil is an arts professor and has held a studio at the Charlotte Art League for 23 years. Become part of his exhibit by jotting your own experience with a favorite tree and hanging it on the Memory Tree! Bosbyshell has collected hundreds of tree memories from folks around North Carolina. The memories range from nostalgic to profound. Posters of the collected memories are free to take home as a souvenir of the exhibit.



African Art Speaks

At African Art Speaks, we are committed to showcasing an extensive range of artistic expressions, including abstract paintings, sculptures, fabrics, masks, weavings, basketry, pottery, beading, musical instruments, and jewelry. Each piece carries the spirit of its creator, bridging the gap between continents and cultures.



Alvin C. Jacobs Jr. - Environmental Justice Photography

Alvin's distinctive aesthetic is marked by a propensity toward highlighting stark contrast and in dealing in the black & white - both in photography and in the world. This talent for capturing the heart of his subjects on camera has led to him being named one of Charlotte Magazine's 2018 "Charlotteans of the Year" and Creative Loafing's "Best Photographer of 2018."



Bunny Gregory - Arts & Crafts Station

Bunny is currently working on the UNDERGROUND Mobile Art Studio, empowering young Black artists, especially in under-served communities. It allows engagement with youth(and the young at heart), who otherwise don't have the funds or resources to indulge in the Arts. Bunny's personal work is influenced by Afrocentric culture, addresses racial and economic disparity through illustration, comic-style art, pen & ink, and collage on reclaimed boards. Stop her station to paint your very own planter and plant your own flowers, just in time for Mother's Day!



Crista Cammaroto - Terra Forma

As an organizer, curator and Director of Galleries for UNC Charlotte in the past, Crista worked with Clean Air Carolina extensively for a Keeping Watch on Air Project.
